

CONCORD – On March 6, 2014 Detectives from the Concord Police Department arrested an Antrim, NH man for multiple counts of sexual assault. Arrested was,

The investigation leading up to Wilson's arrest involved multiple law enforcement agencies, to include the Concord Police Department, Hopkinton Police Department and the Antrim Police Department.

The complaint was originally filed with the Hopkinton Police Department in January, 2014. At that time it was alleged that Max Wilson, who is a registered sex offender, was having inappropriate contact with a male juvenile.

The initial complaint was that Wilson was living with a family in Antrim and allegedly assaulted a male juvenile while at that residence. The victim juvenile did not live at this residence; rather he was an acquaintance of the family. There are alleged to have been 3 separate assaults over a 3-4 day period.

Through the investigation it was learned that Wilson allegedly assaulted the same male juvenile in both Hopkinton and Concord as well. With this information all three agencies initiated a joint investigation.

The investigation revealed that Wilson had agreed to act as a mentor and tutor for the male juvenile and never disclosed that he was a sex offender to the victim juvenile's family. The family eventually became concerned about Wilson's behavior and researched his name on the Internet. Through these efforts they discovered that he was in fact a registered sex offender. The family then consulted with their church who in turn notified Hopkinton PD.

The investigation revealed that the victim juvenile was allegedly assaulted in various locations in Concord, to include assorted restaurants and retail establishments. These assaults are alleged to have occurred over the first two weeks in January.

Antrim Police issued warrants for Wilson in late January at which time he was arrested and held on \$50,000 cash bail. Wilson has been incarcerated at the Hillsborough County House of Corrections (Valley Street Jail) since his arrest.

Warrants for both Concord PD and Hopkinton PD were subsequently issued and served to Wilson at the Valley St. Jail yesterday. He is due to be arraigned this morning, March 7<sup>th</sup>, at the 6<sup>th</sup> Circuit District Division-Concord (Concord District Court).
