Conduct After an Accident

CPD Case# 15-2128-OF

CONCORD, NH – On January 14, 2015 at approximately 9:00 AM Concord Police took a report of a hit-and-run accident that had occurred earlier that morning.

Police met with the victim, identified as a 16-year-old boy. According to the victim, the accident in question occurred at 7:45 AM. The victim said that he was riding his bike to school in a westerly direction on Warren Street when he approached the intersection with North Spring Street. The victim reported that he was on the eastbound side of Warren Street when he approached the intersection.

The victim said he had planned to continue westerly through the intersection when he saw a red Chevy 4-door car to his right. The car was traveling westerly and on the westbound side of Warren Street. The victim saw that it was a female driving the car.

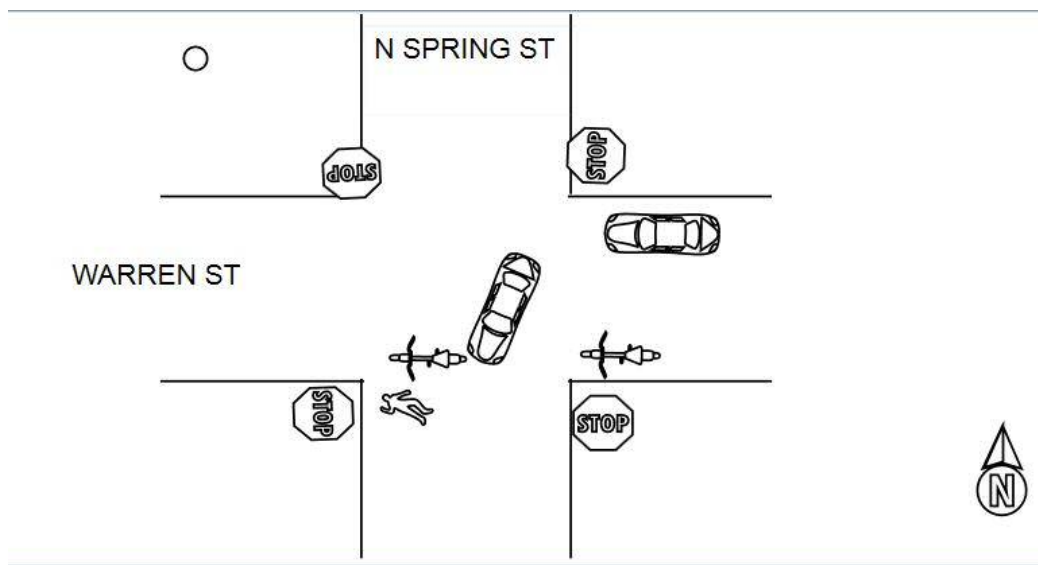
The victim said he “waved the car through”, saying he could see she was going to make a left turn to go south on North Spring Street. The woman then waved the victim through, so he proceeded through the intersection. However, as the victim was approximately halfway through the intersection, the woman drove into the intersection and struck him. According to the victim, the car’s right front bumper struck the rear wheel of his bike. This resulted in the victim falling off his bike and striking his shoulder on the ground.

As the victim looked up, he could see the female driver mouthing the words, “Oh my God”. Despite this, the female driver continued on without stopping.

The victim described the female as being approximately 30-years-old with short, dirty-blond hair and glasses.

The victim was transported to Concord Hospital by his father. The victim was treated for a broken clavicle and released from the hospital.

The Concord Police Department is asking the public to locate and identify the operator of the suspect vehicle in this case.
