ROUTE 3 / NORTH STATE STREET CORRIDOR IMPROVEMENTS

Work on the replacement of the existing storm sewer is underway on North State Street. Next week, the contractor will continue to install new drainage facilities. Construction will persist between McGuire Street and Palm Street. Traffic delays are to be expected in this area, typically between 7:00 AM and 6:00 PM. Motorists are advised to seek alternate routes whenever possible.



ROAD PAVING

This summer's road paving program has begun on North Spring Street. Pavement on the sidewalks and driveways have been removed and gravel has been installed for easy access. The contractor plans to reclaim the street on Monday, and base pavement will be applied by the end of next week. Funds for the paving were received from the Concord School District as part of the new Kimball/Walker School construction.

SOUTH MAIN STREET DRAIN LINE REPAIRS

The General Services Department completed drain line repairs on South Main Street this week, in preparation of this year's paving program. The drainage work will be temporarily paved awaiting a complete overlay this summer.



PENACOOK WATER MAIN CLEANING & LINING

Next week, the contractor will continue to hook up residential services to the temporary main. Test pits will be dug in the road at various locations in preparation for the lining of the water main scheduled in early July. Minor traffic delays are anticipated.

NH PROPERTY TAX RELIEF PROGRAM

Residents are reminded that June 30th is the deadline to apply for the State of New Hampshire's Low and Moderate Income Homeowner's Property Tax Relief Program. Forms are available on the web at www.nh.gov/revenue, or may be obtained from the City's Assessing Office located in City Hall, between the hours of 8:00 AM and 4:30 PM, Monday thru Friday.

Property owners who owned and occupied their homes on April 1, 2011 may apply to the State for relief of a portion of the State education property tax. There is no age requirement or asset limit for this program. A single person whose total household income was \$20,000 or less in 2011 and married persons or heads of New Hampshire households with total household income of \$40,000 or less may apply.

Forms and documentation should be mailed to the NH Department of Revenue Administration, Document Processing Division, P.O. Box 299, Concord, NH 03302-0299 and must be **postmarked no later than June 30, 2012**. Applicants will need a copy of their January or March 2012 tax bill and a copy of their 2011 Federal tax return. If the property is in a trust, a copy of the entire trust document must be submitted.
